The London to Sydney Marathon is rightly regarded as one of motor sport's toughest and most prestigious events.

The Marathon is, simply, unique. In view of that special status, it is entirely fitting that the next running should be in the year 2000. The event is not only the ideal way for the rallying community to mark the dawning of the New Millennium, it also complements the Olympics in Sydney, where the race ends on July 2nd.

The course, taking in tough stages in varied and demanding conditions in Europe, the Middle East, South East Asia and Australia, would be demanding enough in today's cars. I wish all those who are taking part the best of luck for a safe and successful race. And I hope that everyone who watches the Marathon enjoys the event as much as the participants.
